



Early Childhood Early Intervention

National Disability Insurance Scheme

Early childhood intervention services will begin to be delivered through the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) as it rolls out across the country.

The NDIS approach to early childhood early intervention (ECEI) aims to provide all children aged 0–6 years with developmental delay or disability the best start in life, regardless of diagnosis.

Access to early intervention gives parents, families and carers the ability to help their children develop and use the skills they need to participate meaningfully throughout their lives.

The NDIS will partner with local services, ensuring families have access to early childhood early intervention quickly and easily. Families with children aged 0–6 years with developmental delay or disability will be directed to an ECEI Partner in their local area.

Supports and services

There are a wide range of supports available for children with developmental delay or disability and their families. These will be explained further to you by your local ECEI Partner.

Supports can be offered in a range of everyday environments such as at home, childcare, playgroup, sporting and community activities. Families and carers will also be supported to help their children develop and use new skills.

Every child and family will require different types of supports and services according to their needs. ECEI Partners will work with families to provide the right level of support based on the needs of each child and family.
